PROPORTIONAL REPRESENTATION.

POLITICAL ECONOMY—IT IS A REMEDY FOR MANY POLITICAL EVILS.

Did it ever strike you that the existing method of election by Wards and Single Member Districts is clumsy, inefficient, unfair and unscientific? It makes the nomination of candidates a monopoly of the two party machines. It promotes gerrymandering, bribery and treating. It causes disfranchisement of a great body of voters at every election. It prevents the direct representation of labor, of reform movements and of smaller parties. It tends to keep the best men out of politics and puts a premium on dodging, shuffling and evasion. It promotes and encourages the undesirable habit of personal canvassing on behalf of candidates. It perpetuates party bitterness and unreasoning party prejudice. And it is the greatest obstacle in the way of good civic and municipal government. Yet for these great evils there is a simple and fundamental remedy. That remedy is known as Proportional Representation. What does it mean? Proportional Representation means large districts returning from six to ten members, instead of small districts returning one or two members. It means that those six to ten members are voted for in such a way as to give a real representation to all the parties large or small, in the district, in proportion to voting strength. It means the abolition of the ward system in municipalities. The best plans require that each elector should have only one vote and that there should be some way, direct or indirect, of transferring votes from candidates who have more votes than sufficient to elect, to candidates who have too few, *in accord with the wishes of the voters themselves.*
