All exhibits in the following competitions must be placed in the Main Exhibit Hall / Agricultural Produce Building on Wednesday, July 24th, 2019 between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.

Class M: Home Baking

Section: Breads-full loaf

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

- Loaf of white bread.
- Loaf of 60% whole wheat bread.
- Loaf of white bread made in bread machine.
- Rolls-dinner, white, no glazing (3).

Section: Muffins, Biscuits and Loaves

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

- Notation: Only 1/2 of a loaf is to be exhibited.*
- Banana loaf, fruit and nuts permitted.
 - Chocolate zucchini loaf.
 - Plain tea biscuits (3).
 - Fruit muffins, name the fruit (3).

Section: Cakes

Prizes: 1st - \$10, 2nd - \$8, 3rd - \$6

Notations: Cakes are to be baked in pans measuring approximately 8", either round or square. Only 1/4 of the cake is to be displayed on a 6" Styrofoam plate.

- Chocolate cake, iced, single layer, attractively displayed with garnish.
- White cake, iced, single layer, attractively displayed with garnish.

Section: Pies and Tarts

Prizes: 1st - \$10, 2nd - \$8, 3rd - \$6

Notations: Only one slice of pie is to be exhibited. This slice should be displayed on a 6" Styrofoam plate. No commercial filling allowed.

- Strawberry Rhubarb pie.
- Raisin pie.
- Baked pie shell, entire shell will be judged on appearance and taste.
- Butter tarts with raisins (3), may also be entered in Class O Section 1, entries must include a tag for each class to be considered in both classes.

Section: Cookies and Squares

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

- Notations: Cookies are to be 2-2 1/2" in diameter. Squares are to be 1-1 1/2" square.*
- Chocolate chip cookies (3).
 - Peanut butter cookies (3).
 - Oatmeal cookies with raisins (3).
 - Sugar cookies, undecorated (3).
 - Brownies, no nuts (3), icing optional.
 - Date squares (3).

Section: No Bake

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

- Maple fudge (3).
- Bark pieces (3) with recipe.

Class N: Canned/Bottled Goods

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

Notations: All exhibits must have been made within the past 12 months. Exhibits must be shown in either 250 ml or 500 ml jars. Jars must be sealed; do not open. No wax.

Section: Jams

- Strawberry jam, cooked.
- Raspberry jam.
- Blueberry jam.
- Any single berry jam not previously listed. (e.g. Blackberry, service berry)

Section: Jellies

- Apple or crabapple jelly.
- Grape jelly.
- Mint jelly.
- Any other jelly not previously listed.

Section: Relishes

- Cranberry relish.
- Zucchini relish.
- Corn relish.
- Ripe cucumber relish.

Section: Pickles

- Dill pickles with garlic.
- Sweet pickles.
- Beet pickles.
- Any other pickle, single or mixed vegetable, not previously listed.

Class O: O.A.A.S. Competitions

Sections

- Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Butter Tart Competition. *Must be also entered into Section M-14. Raisins permitted, no nuts or fruit. Tarts must be full size; no mini or bite-size tarts.*
Local Prize: 1st - \$20 added.

- Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Hand Quilted Competition. *Must be entered into Section S-1 or S-2. Quilt must be solely made and hand quilted by the Exhibitor and shall be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter.*
Local Prize: 1st - \$20 added.

- Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Machine Quilt Competition. *Must be entered into Section S-5. Quilt must be solely made and machine quilted by the Exhibitor and shall be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter. Note the article can be square, rectangular etc.*
Local Prize: 1st - \$20 added.

- Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Youth Chocolate Chip Cookie Competition. *Must be entered into Section U3-7. Three Plain Chocolate Chip Cookies, without nuts,*

- Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Youth Chocolate Chip Cookie Competition. *Must be entered into Section U3-7. Three Plain Chocolate Chip Cookies, without nuts,*

are to be no larger than 3" and no smaller than 2".

Local Prize: 1st - \$10 added.

Class P: Crafts

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

Notations: All items exhibited shall be executed within the last two years and can only be shown for a maximum of two years.

Sections

- Handmade soft toy, child safe.
- A craft using lace doily(s), doily(s) may be purchased.
- Handmade book mark, any medium.
- Handmade garden marker, any medium.
- Handmade necklace, any medium.
- Handmade earrings, any medium.
- Something new from something old.

Section: Christmas Corner

- Set of three Christmas tree decorations, ready to hang, any medium.
- Handmade Christmas card with envelope.
- Christmas door decoration.
- Decorated Christmas gift bag, any medium.
- Handmade Christmas stocking.

Class Q: Photography

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

Notations: Photographs will be judged on imagination, focus, exposure, composition and interest. One photo (4"x 6") should be mounted on a piece of Bristol board for the following sections. Photographs must be in colour unless otherwise listed.

- Busy bee - a bee collecting pollen.
- Child or children in motion.
- Winter snow - landscape scene.
- My favourite pet.
- Wildlife.
- Close up of a snowflake.
- Bicycles (no people).
- Fun at the fair.
- A collection of fall leaves.
- Halloween fun.
- Sleepy time - can depict either people or animals sleeping.
- Play time with Grandparents - grandparents and grandchildren both in the photograph.

Class R: Flowers and Plants

Notations: All entries must be grown by the Exhibitor.

Section: Cut Flowers

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

- Annuals in a vase, 5 different varieties, two stems each, artistic arrangement.
- Asiatic lily, 1 stem.
- Astilbe, 3 stems.
- Coleus foliage, 1 stem.
- Collection of foliage, 3 varieties, 1 stem each.
- Sumer bulb, not listed, 1 specimen
- Echinacea, cone flower, 3 blooms.
- Clematis, 3 blooms.
- Hosta leaves, 3 different cultivars, 1 stem of each.
- Liatris, 3 stems.
- Marigolds, large, over 3", three stems.
- Marigolds, small, under 3", three stems.
- Snap dragons, 3 spikes.
- Pansy or viola, 3 stems.
- Perennial, not mentioned above, 1 stem.
- Perennials, in a vase, 5 different varieties, 2 stems each, artistic arrangement.
- Petunias, 3 sprays, double.
- Petunias, 3 sprays, single.
- Phlox, 3 sprays, perennial.
- Rose, 1 bloom, floating in a rose bowl.
- Rose, miniature, 1 stem.
- Rose, shrub, 1 spray.
- Rudbeckia, 3 blooms.
- Sedum, 3 sprays.
- Shasta daisy, 3 stems.
- Sweet peas, 3 stems, 1 colour.
- Yarrow, 3 stems.
- Zinnia, 3 stems with blooms 2" - 4".

Section: Potted Plants

Notation: Pots not to exceed 8" unless requested.

- Most unusual plant, named.
- Foliage plant, not listed, in maximum 8" pot.
- Trailing plant for foliage, hanger attached.
- Mixed planter, minimum of 3 varieties, maximum of a 12" pot.
- Portulaca plants, potted.
- Cactus or succulent, single specimen.
- Coleus, established in a pot, 1 plant.
- Geranium, 1 plant in bloom.
- Aloe Vera plant.
- House plant not listed, named.

Section: Design Category

Prizes: 1st - \$10, 2nd - \$8, 3rd - \$5

Notations: Designs must be arranged by the Exhibitor. Accessories may be used. Soil not permitted. Material may be obtained from other garden sources (i.e. family or neighbours)

- All White: *use white material only except for foliage.*
- Black Magic: *a design in the style of choice using fresh and / or dried material, accessories may be used.*

41. Green with Envy: *Use fresh foliage only (no flowers), a design of exhibitor's choice.*

- A Simple Welcome: *a small design (not to exceed 10") suitable for a guest room.*
- Tiny Treasures: *a miniature arrangement of fresh cut flowers not to exceed 5" in any direction.*
- Child's Play: *an arrangement using fresh material in a child's toy.*
- Simplicity: *a design using one fresh flower only, other fresh or dried material may be used.*

Class S: Homecraft

Notations: SMA-Sample Material Attached. SYA-Sample Yarn Attached. Soiled entries will not be judged.

Section: Quilting

Prizes: 1st - \$30, 2nd - \$25, 3rd - \$20

- Quilt, hand quilted and hand appliqued, minimum finished size of 39" x 76", pattern named on entry tag. (sma)
- Quilt, hand quilted, minimum of minimum finished size of 39" x 76", pattern named on entry tag. (sma)
- Quilt, any technique, any size, machine quilted, domestic machine.
- Quilt, any technique, any size, machine quilted, long arm machine, quilter if different to be named on entry tag. (sma)
- Machine Quilt, solely made and machine quilted by exhibitor, with a minimum of 30" x 40" measured on the perimeter, pattern named on the entry tag. (sma)
- Quilt, hand quilted, any technique, any size, pattern named. (sma)

Prizes: 1st - \$10, 2nd - \$8, 3rd - \$6

- Quilted table runner. (sma)
- Crib quilt. (sma)

Section: Knitting

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

- Adult mittens. (sya)
- Pair of slippers for adult or child. (sya)
- Child's hat and mittens set. (sya)
- Adult scarf, not infinity style. (sya)
- Infinity scarf. (sya)
- Shawl. (sya)
- Hat or toque. (sya)
- Item of knitting not listed here or under Miscellaneous. (sya)

Section: Crocheting

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

- Afghan, any size. (sya)

- Wall hanging, maximum 48" x 48", ready to hang, no panels. (sma)

Class T: Antiques

Prizes: 1st - \$5, 2nd - \$4, 3rd - \$3

Notations: An antique is recognized as an item which is at least 50 years old. Historical interest and approximate age of entry would be appreciated but not necessary for a prize. Small cracks / flaws will not disqualify items. Items must be small enough to be hand held. Only amateurs may enter; no collectors. Items will be displayed in a fenced area.

Sections

- Tea cup and saucer.
- Early kitchen utensil. (e.g. washboard, rolling pin, mixing bowl, butter print, etc.)
- Early piece of glassware. (e.g. goblet, cake plate, etc.)
- Coin, token or paper money.
- Christmas ornament or decoration.
- Cookbook.
- Magazine.
- Hand tool, no larger than 18".
- Postcard.
- Calendar.
- Handkerchief.
- Woman's gloves.
- Advertisement / shop sign.
- Any item of Canadiana.
